A patient visited Restore Dental Gurgaon with a broken front tooth and a clear expectation immediate fix.

The tooth's location in the front made it not only a functional issue but also an aesthetic emergency.

Traditional Treatment Protocols (And Their Drawbacks)

In most dental clinics across Delhi NCR, the standard approach for such cases includes:

- Tooth extraction
- A waiting period of 3 months
- Implant placement with bone graft and membrane (due to post-extraction bone loss)
- Another 3 to 6 months before the crown is placed

Total treatment time: 6 to 9 months This long timeline often adds emotional, aesthetic, and lifestyle stress to the patient.

Our Modern Approach One Appointment, One Solution

We opted for an immediate implant placement with a temporary crown — all done in a single sitting. What made this possible?

The Socket Shield technique.



What is the Socket Shield Technique?

A minimally invasive and advanced surgical procedure where a **small fragment of the pa** tooth root is preserved during extraction.
This preserved "shield" protects:
The natural bone structure e patient's

- The surrounding **gum contour** The overall **smile aesthetics**

Step-by-Step Summary of the Procedure

- Careful extraction of the broken tooth
- Partial root fragment retained using Socket Shield
 Immediate implant placed into the socket
 A temporary crown was fixed, restoring aesthetics

 No bone loss
